As from January 2003 the Office for National Statistics have replaced the workforce-based rates for sub-regional areas with a new resident-based measure. Local area claimant count figures are now published as a proportion of the resident working age population (16-59/64) as derived from the mid-2001 population estimates, figures are available for local authorities and above. The new percentage figures are referred to as proportions to distinguish them from the workforce-based rates, which will remain available at regional/country level.

CAUTION NEEDED WHEN MAKING COMPARISONS

Resident-based figures are not comparable with the remaining work-force rates.

New 2003 statistical ward data now available.

As of the February 2004 edition of the Unemployment Bulletin, the ward level figures are based on the new 2003 statistical wards, which replace the frozen 1991 ward boundaries used previously. It is NOT possible to compare the two geographies and at present no back data is available for the new wards.

Ward level resident-based unemployment proportions are calculated by Leicestershire County Council - They are calculated by expressing the number of unemployed as a percentage of the working age (16-59/64) population from the 2001 Census.

Up until January 2003 the official unemployment rate was calculated using workforce-based denominators calculated from the Annual Business Inquiry. Workforce-based rates were calculated by expressing the estimated number of people claiming unemployment benefits as a percentage of the total estimated workforce. However, workforce-based rates can underestimate local level unemployment. This can occur in areas where there is significant commuting, as the sample is boosted by those coming into an area to work. This would therefore mask deprivation, and was a significant problem within Leicester City.

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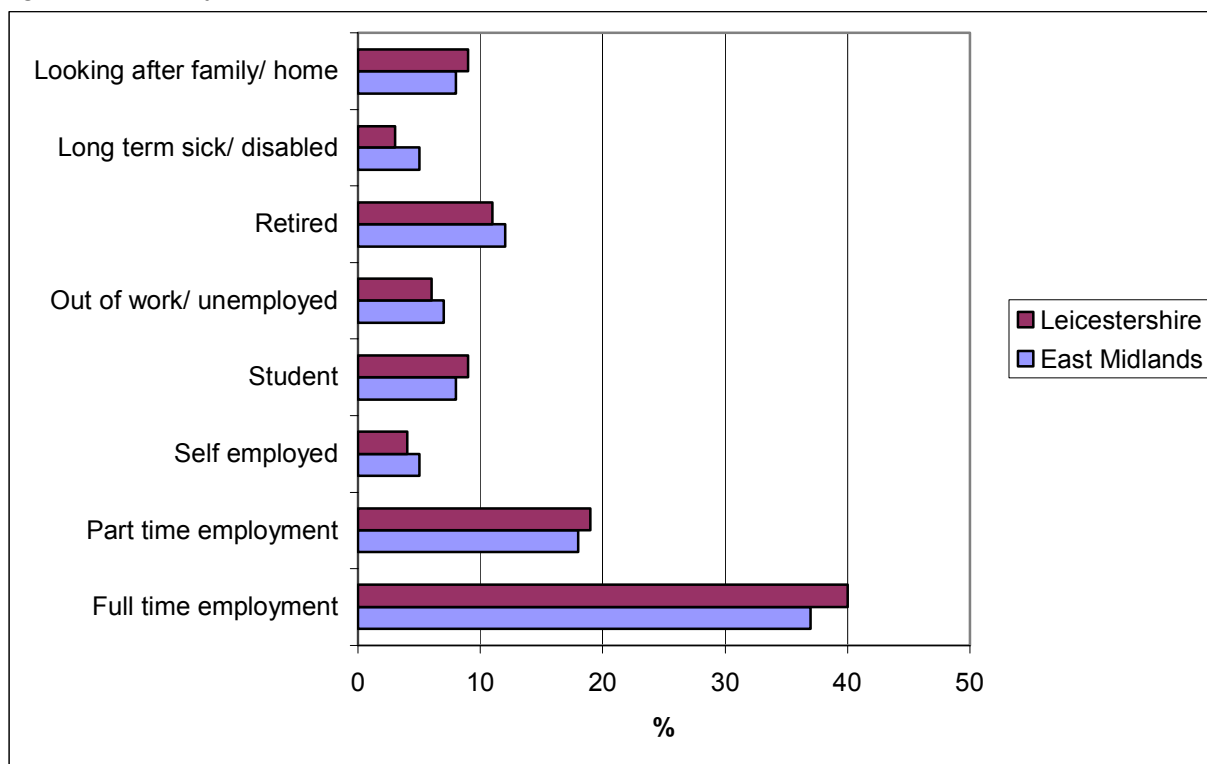
East Midlands Life and Work Survey

East Midlands Life and Work survey was commissioned by emda on behalf of the East Midlands Observatory and undertaken by MRUK. The East Midlands Life and Work Survey is a survey of 18,000 regional households and is a continuation of the Regional Household Survey. Themes covered by the survey include work, skills, health, lifestyle and communities. The first releases from the survey are available to download on the Intelligence East Midlands website www.emintelligence.com

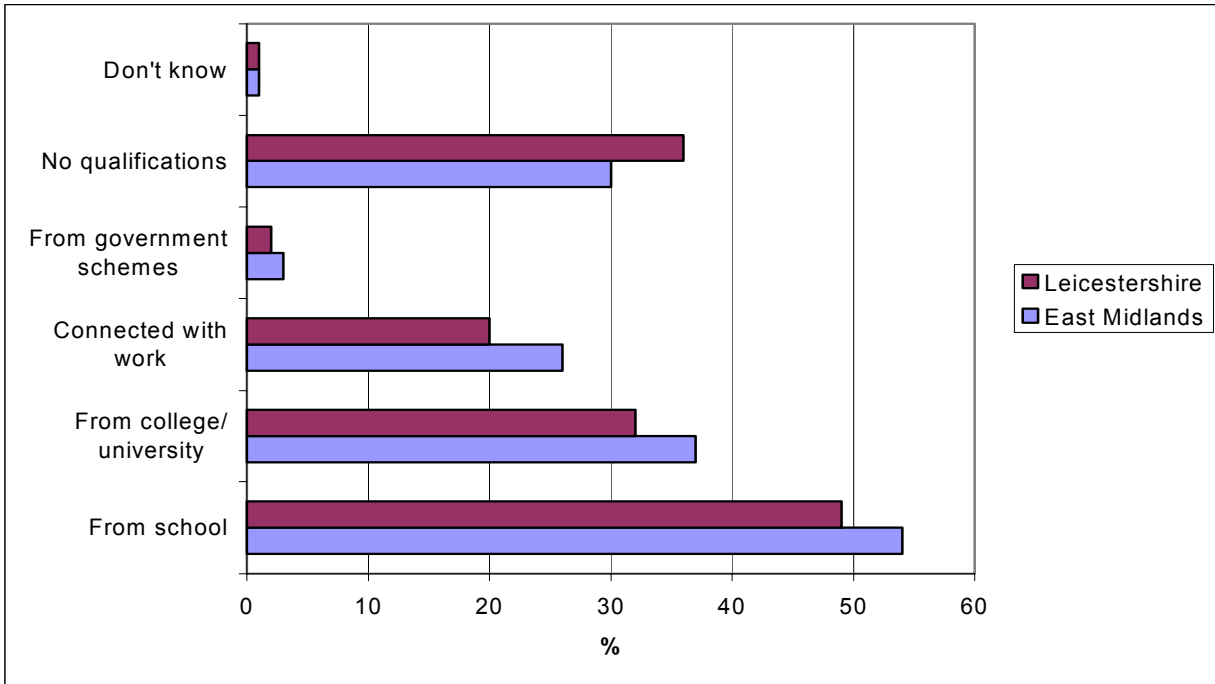
Figure 1: Employment status for the Leicestershire LSC area

The survey estimates that the Leicestershire LSC area has a higher proportion of respondents in employment than the East Midlands region. Figure 1 shows that 63% of respondents in the Leicestershire LSC area are in full time employment, part time employment or are self employed, in comparison the regional level is 60%.

6% of respondents from Leicestershire are economically active but out of work at the present time (i.e. are unemployed claiming job seekers allowance or are unemployed not claiming job seekers allowance). The East Midlands rate for respondents out of work/ unemployed is marginally higher (7%).

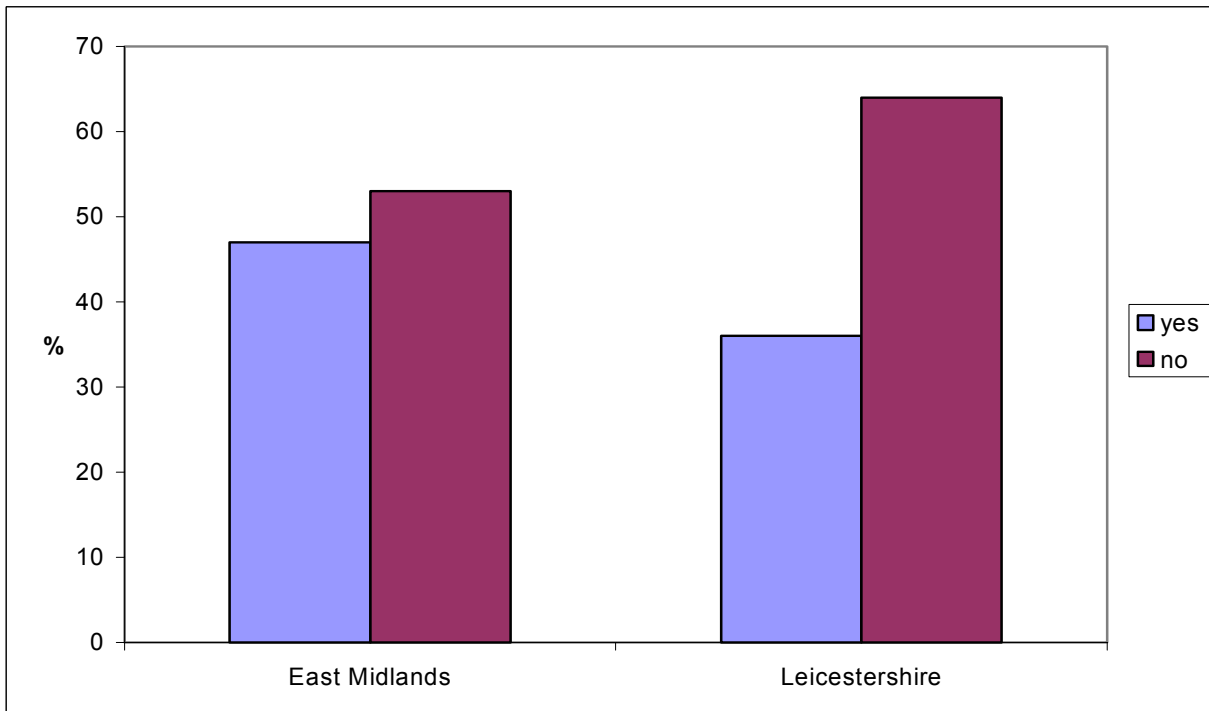
Figure 2: Current Qualifications in the Leicestershire LSC area and the East Midlands Region

The East Midlands Life and Work Survey also estimated the levels of qualifications within the Leicestershire LSC region. Overall as figure 2 displays, just under half (49%) of respondents have qualifications obtained from their school education, this is lower than the East Midlands region (54%). Within the Leicestershire LSC area the number of respondents saying they have no qualifications is considerably higher than the East Midlands region as a whole. Some 36% of respondents from Leicestershire have no qualification compared to 30% for the region.

Figure 3 shows a comparison between the Leicestershire LSC area and the East Midlands region with regards to training provision at work. 36% of respondents in the Leicestershire LSC area have had, or are currently undertaking training for the type of work they currently do. This figure is considerably lower than for the East Midlands region as a whole where 47% of respondents had took part in some form of training.
